Last June we purchased a point of care machine for the neonatal intensive care unit at St Ann's Bay hospital and thus made a huge impact on the care of sick babies. We are continuing to try to raise funds to purchase equipment to improve care in the hospital as well as on the medical mission. This year we hope to raise enough to purchase a laser machine to be able to increase the number of glaucoma surgeries.
